Ladies Lunch and Meeting: Will be Sunday January 29th after morning services (Ladies only).

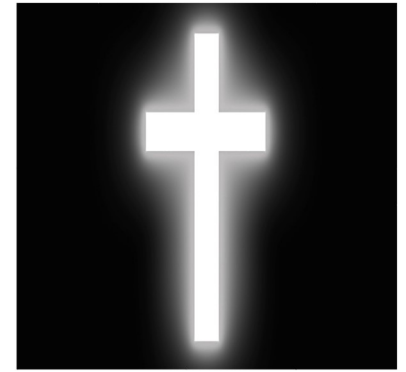
Duty Sign-Ups: Check the glass wall so sign up for duties.

Refuge from the Storm– By Ronnie Potter

On April 27, 1942 an EF4 tornado struck Pryor, Oklahoma, killing 52 people and injuring 350 others. My parents, both young teenagers, and their families were all in the path of the storm as it progressed eastward. They all had stories as they recounted the storm, but my grandpa Frank's was the most chilling.

As grandpa told the events of that late afternoon you could hear and see the emotions that he went through. He said as he was walking home, after working at a saw mill a few miles from home the sky turned an eerie green color. Trees suddenly began blowing down around him as he would run one way and then the other trying to avoid the crashing giants. With tears in his eyes he would say, "I didn't think I was gonna make it home". Gladly Grandpa Frank made it home to an anxious and thankful family.

Just as our Lord watched over my grandpa that April afternoon and brought him safely through the storm, he has been doing the same for faithful children of God since creation. Isaiah, in Isaiah 25: 4 praised God when he said "you have been a refuge to the poor, a refuge for the needy in their distress, a shelter from the storm and a shade from the heat, for the breath of the ruthless is like a storm against the wall".

Sooner or later we will all face life's storms. Psalms 46: 1 tells us "God is our refuge and strength, an ever present help in trouble". So with total confidence and peace know we all have refuge from the storm if we have faith in God.
