Senior Honor Night: Will be the evening of Sunday May 7th. Raven Lay is graduating this year!

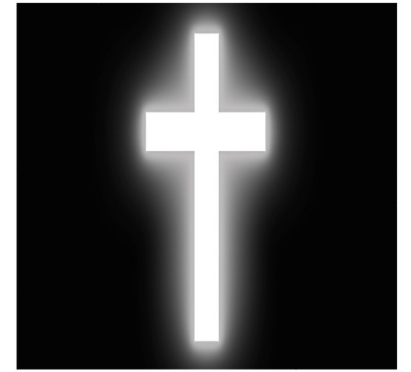

Just a Bundle of Sticks: By Neal Pollard

In Acts 28 after Paul and his shipmates survived a shipwreck and landed on Malta, the stranded passengers found themselves cold and wet in a strange place. The natives however, were very friendly and built a fire for them all (Acts 28:2). It is interesting that Paul "gathered a bundle of sticks, and laid them on the fire" (verse 3). This was when an extremely deadly viper bit Paul.

Yet at this point in the story we often over look an important little fact that helps to demonstrate the greatness of the Apostle. Simply put, Paul did his part. When the others had built a fire, Paul was not content to let the others do it all. He did his share. Not only that, he did his share even at great personal cost and risk. He might have rationalized that he had already done so much and been through much and therefore deserved a break. No, instead he worked and served.

You may be a busy active servant of God. You may have done much in the past for the cause of Christ. Yet I think about how notable and inspiring it is to others when you gather your own bundle of sticks to help the fire others have started. It may be noted and remembered long after you are gone. Brothers and Sisters let us start picking up our bundle of sticks.
