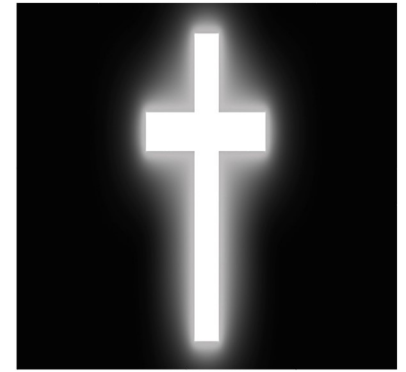
Bob Case Funeral: Services will be Monday, here at the building at 1 PM.

Your God Will Be My God– By Paul Walvoord

But Ruth replied, “Do not urge me to leave you or to turn my back from you. Where you go I will go, and where you stay I will stay. Your people will be my people and your God my God.
-Ruth 1:16 NIV

What amazing friendship, faith and courage that it must have taken for Ruth to speak to Naomi, her mother-in-law. Had Ruth not chosen to follow Naomi back home then the history of Israel would be extremely different than it is today.
